What do I want to add, tear out, move, trim back, etc. as spring begins?





Many of us have found inspiration at the SWOGC semiannual Plant Sales. This white trumpet plant – 6 ft tall or more and bursting with blooms – was a 6-inch leafless stick at the Fall Sale just a year ago. The Clivia Nobilis, or Forest Lily, with its glowing orange blossoms was donated to the plant sale by one of our members two years ago. Its bloom this year was worth the wait. One tiny little potted plant from a few years ago found its home in a garden. It now puts forth beautiful cranberry red blooms that you can dry and turn into Hibiscus Tea which is known for its multiple healthful properties.
